NATALIA BRZEZINA
Policy Officer - Research and Innovation Unit of DG AGRI, Belgium

Natalia Brzezina is a policy officer in the research and innovation unit at the European Commission's Directorate-General for Agriculture and Rural Development. She contributes to shaping EU strategies for agricultural research and innovation, focusing on strengthening agricultural knowledge and innovations systems across the EU. Before joining the European Commission, she earned a PhD from KU Leuven, researching food systems. She has also worked in the agri-food industry.

The presentation will provide an overview of the EU policy for research, innovation and knowledge exchange in agriculture, forestry and rural areas, with focus on initiatives that support women-led innovation. It will encompass initiatives supported under the Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) as well as Horizon Europe that work in synergy under the common framework of the European Innovation Partnership for Agriculture (EIP-AGRI). Several examples of Horizon-funded research and innovation projects as well as CAP-funded operational groups led by women will be showcased. Finally, the presentation will highlight the main outcomes of the EU CAP Network EIP-AGRI workshop 'Women-led innovations in agriculture and rural areas'.

MAURA FARRELL University of Galway, Ireland

Associate Professor Maura Farrell is the Coordinator of the FLIARA project at the University of Galway and a full-time lecturer in the Discipline of Geography. Maura's research interests include rural and agricultural geography, processes of social, cultural and economic change for rural inhabitants and rural migration.

VÍCTOR R. MARTÍNEZ Consulta Europa, Spain

Víctor Martínez is part of the Communication Team of the FLIARA Project at Consulta Europa and has been involved in interviewing the Spanish case studies for the project. His expertise spans the development of digital products on sustainability, self-consumption in the Canary Islands, Spain.



This presentation offers an overview of the FLIARA project, which aims to enhance women's roles in agriculture and rural innovation across Europe. It highlights key objectives and methodologies while showcasing anonymised case studies that demonstrate successful interventions by Agricultural Knowledge and Innovation Systems in Ireland and Spain. Project ZAMm unterwegs (Together on the way) - education for female decision makers and system change actors



MICHAELA GLATZL Austrian Chamber of Agriculture, Austria

I have been working as a consultant for women farmers at the Austrian Chamber of Agriculture for over 13 years, before that I was a consultant for crop production and business management for 10 years. As the Austrian Women Farmers' Association, we have been representing the interests of 130,000 women in agriculture and forestry for more than 50 years. We make their achievements as women farmers on the farms and as officials visible.

Rural areas thrive on the active participation of their inhabitants, especially woman farmers. In Austria, 35 % of all farms are run by women and a further 12 % are run with their partner. Women in agriculture and forestry prove themselves every day in their profession. Their wealth of ideas, ingenuity and perseverance make them successful businesswomen. This potential needs to be utilised more than ever in the committees. Motivated women should be encouraged to take the lead with confidence. Since 2009, the EU-funded ZAMm programme 'Professional Representation in Rural Areas' has offered the perfect training for anyone who wants to take on responsibility for public tasks. Innovative agriculture and forestry without women - unthinkable for us!

The FLIARA Project

The EU-Funded, FLIARA project (Female-led Innovation in Agriculture and Rural Areas) champions women driving sustainable farming and rural development across Europe. By conducting case studies, research, and directly engaging with female entrepreneurs, FLIARA aims to build a more inclusive and sustainable future for rural communities.
